6. BOARD MEMBER INITIATIVE: SELDEN'S LANDING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TRAFFIC CALMING RESOLUTION

Supervisor Miller moved the Board of Supervisors request that VDOT authorize the implementation of traffic calming measures in the Lansdowne neighborhood of Cotton Commons near Seldens Landing Elementary School. (Consent Item) (Seconded by Supervisor McGimsey. The motion passed 9-0.)

7. BOARD MEMBER INITIATIVE: PERFORMANCE BONDS FOR NON-CONVENTIONAL ON-SITE WASTEWATER SYSTEMS

Supervisor Burton moved that the Board of Supervisors direct staff to prepare an amendment to the Codified Ordinances to require (1) a performance and maintenance bond for the installation and maintenance of any non-conventional onsite sewage disposal system, and; (2) a 200% reserve drainfield for non-conventional onsite sewage disposal systems.

Supervisor Burton further moved that the Board direct staff to publish notice of the Board's intention to propose the amendments for passage. (Seconded by Supervisor Miller.)

Supervisor Burton accepted Chairman York's friendly amendment that staff provide the Board draft ordinance language prior to advertisement of language and the scheduling of a public hearing. (Seconded by Supervisor Miller.

The amended motion passed 8-1, Supervisor Delgaudio voted no.)
